2) Latest Corona Virus travel advice

Australia is closing its borders to all non-citizens and non-residents.

The entry ban takes effect from 9pm AEDT Friday, 20 March 2020, with exemptions only for Australian citizens, permanent residents and their immediate family, including spouses, legal guardians and dependants.

New Zealand citizens who live in Australia as Australian residents are also exempt, as are New Zealanders transiting to New Zealand. Exemptions for Pacific Islanders transiting to their home countries will continue to apply.

Australian citizens and permanent residents and those exempt from our entry restrictions will continue to be subject to a strict 14 days self-isolation.

Our number one priority is to slow the spread of coronavirus to save lives.

Our government has taken this unprecedented step because around 80 per cent of coronavirus cases in Australia are people who caught the virus overseas before entering Australia, or people who have had a direct contact with someone who has returned from overseas.

Our previous travel and entry restrictions have already meant that daily travel to Australia by non-citizens has been reduced to about one third of what it was this time last year.

We also strongly urge Australians looking to return home to do so as soon as possible. This follows our upgraded travel advice for all Australians not to travel overseas, at all.

The Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade will provide consular advice and assistance, but the capacity for DFAT to provide consular services may be limited by local restrictions on movement, as well as the full scale of the challenges posed by coronavirus.

Australians who cannot, or do not want to, return home should follow the advice of local authorities and minimise their risk of coronavirus exposure by self-isolating.

The government is in discussions with airlines about the continuance of some international flights for the purpose of bringing Australians home and continuing the movement of goods and freight.

These challenges vary and the situation is changing rapidly.

Our government will continue to act on the best available information to keep Australians safe.

4) DHA advice for temporary visa holders

The Immigration minister met with the MIA today and here are the notes from that meeting

The teleconference meeting was attended by representatives of the leading industry groups across Australia, including the Australian Industry Group, Australian Chamber of Commerce and Industry, Business Council of Australia, regional Australia Institute, Migration Council of Australia and Department of Home Affairs representatives.

The meeting discussed a variety of policy issues and impacts related to the travel bans with a surprising amount of common agreement on how these should be managed.

The Government is very conscious of the significant and adverse impact the travel bans are having on Australians, Australia's goods and trade, on Australian businesses small and large, and not least on temporary visa holders. The Department is attempting to manage the situation with as light a touch as possible within the current circumstances.

The consistent message was that the Government and Department of Home Affairs are attempting to be as flexible as possible within the constraints of the legislative framework. As members are aware, while policy can be changed relatively easily, legislation takes a lot longer.

The Department is attempting to make it as simple as possible for onshore visa holders to remain lawful. This includes taking a light touch approach to onshore lodged visitor visas, no further stay waivers and extensions of visa validity where possible. The relaxation of student visa working conditions for supermarkets and aged care are further example of this.

Strategies to ensure essential services and critical infrastructure are maintained are being considered including the necessity for essential and critical occupations to be permitted to enter Australia. Health workers and oil and gas rig changeover crews were mentioned as examples.

Approaches aimed at ensuring the security of food supply by adjusting arrangements for working holiday makers and agricultural sector seasonal workers are also under consideration.

Adjustment to the travel restrictions for temporary visa holders who have already established a presence in Australia may be considered, most likely on a case by case basis.

The Government is also aware that visa holders who lose their livelihoods may become very vulnerable within our communities and are looking at services to alleviate this.

Those who have been granted a permanent visa offshore are still permitted to enter Australia, even where they have not previously been to this country.

Visa processing, for GSM visas in particular, will continue within the constraints of the situation.

Finally, the timing of the curfew was discussed with Minister Tudge explaining that 9 pm was chosen to coordinate with the 12 midnight NZ ban implementation and to give Australian border officials time to notify airlines of the travel restrictions.

As members can see from the above report the meeting was confined to the discussion of policy settings and not to the specific detail of visa subclasses or visa holders circumstances. This report is provided to MIA members to provide them with insight into the direction of the Government's and the Department's thinking at this time.

Tasmania update

The rapidly evolving situation regarding COVID-19 has necessitated temporary changes to eligibility for the Subclass 491: 3A Overseas Applicant (TSOL) nomination category.

As of 20 March 2020, applications for this category are temporarily restricted until further notice to occupations listed in the 'High Demand' section of the Tasmanian Skilled Occupation List (TSOL). Please do not LODGE or PAY for a Category 3A application if your nominated occupation is not listed as 'HIGH DEMAND' on the TSOL. Your application will NOT be assessed.

Applications under Category 3A lodged prior to this date which specify other occupations will still be considered. Applicants with 'High Demand' occupations will, however, be given priority. This means processing times for other Category 3A applications with occupations not listed in the High Demand section will become extended (approximately 6 months from lodgment).

Queensland update

BSMQ SKILLED PROGRAM – SUBCLASS 491 VISA – OPEN

LATEST NEWS – the occupations of Marketing Specialist ANZSCO 225113, and Finance Manager ANZSCO 132211 have now reached invitation quota on 12 March 2020, and have been removed from QSOL. However, if you have already received an invitation to upload documents we will continue to process your application.

COVID-19 (Novel coronavirus) and Australian visas

BSMQ PROCESSING UPDATE 18 MARCH 2020

Subclass 491 remains OPEN.

BSMQ is currently priority processing subclass 491 ONSHORE applicants.

Offshore is still open, however only critical skill shortage occupations such as medical and allied health professionals will be given priority at this time.

Subclass 190 and all business visas (subclass 188 and 132) have met nomination allocation for FY 2019-20.

New quota will be received in July 2020 and applicants will be required to submit a new EOI for Queensland State Nominated visas (subclass 190, 188, 132) at this time.

6) Vetassess update on skills assessments

Message from Vetassess on overseas skills assessments

Dear agent

Please be advised that, in line with Commonwealth Government guidelines around the coronavirus (COVID-19), VETASSESS has decided to cancel all offshore assessments effective immediately.

Assessments for professional occupations are not affected by this, but it will affect these planned offshore assessments for trades:

- South Africa (27th March to 5th April, 2020) – Electrical, Air Conditioning Refrigeration Mechanic and Plumbing (General).
- Philippines (27 April - 1 May, 2020) - Automotive and Engineering Trades, Mechanical Engineering.
- United Kingdom (13 - 14 May, 2020) - Electrician (General), Air-conditioning and Refrigeration Mechanic.
- India (19 - 22 May, 2020) Electrician (General).

We have advised Trades Recognition Australia (TRA) and we will contact the affected applicants who were planning to attend a VETASSESS offshore assessment venue immediately.

We will continue to conduct technical Interviews for applicants via online facilities (Adobe Connect).

We continue to monitor the situation regarding COVID-19 and will advise TRA when offshore assessments can resume.

7) Unofficial March 13th Skill Select results for 189/491

Looks like around 1500 invites for 189s and most occupations remained on 90 points, but importantly moved through the congested dates of 16-20th November 2019 at that score.

To produce our results we collect data from our own clients, online forums, other online sources, and feedback from our FB and newsletter followers. As well as using mathematical logical assumptions we know in the past to be correct.

8) When will you get your 189/491 invite – March 2020 estimates

The 13th March 2020 invitation round looks around 1200-1500 invites

We will continue to estimate an average of 1000 invites per month to take account of DHA changing their numbers randomly and based on what their budgetary figures are for the 2019/20 program year

Assumptions						
DHA have a budget target of 16,652 grants less 4000 for NZ citizens. DHA have a backlog of 8368 points test applicants. To keep at that level, need 8,284 more invites before July20 Factor in 25% wastage is 11045 invites. Each EOI averages 2.6 people but most invites will be single people so 1.4 average per EOI = 7900 potential invites 1000 per month allows a backlog reduction. Split as 65% Pro rata and 35% NON pro rata

For the 491 (family sponsored) visas DHA have limited themselves to only inviting MLTSSL occupations that are non pro rata in most cases. This policy is stated on their official monthly invite results. However a number of the pro rata occupations have not filled up their allocation each month by the time DHA have invited their total round allocation (1000 or 1500 or 300 as it changes each round. And so some pro rata occupations get lucky with an invite. This statistically is unlikely to ever happen for Accountants and Auditors though.

As a result of this limited number of eligible applicants the 491 invite score we anticipate to continue to drop and may get down to 75/80 points soon (including the 15 sponsor points)

10) Family sponsored 491 Conundrum

DHA invited a massive 500 EOIs to lodge 491 applications in the 11th February 2020 round
This high number we believe was as a result of the following perfect storm of circumstances

- The first ever 491 invite round was 11th December 2019 (as the visa only opened on 16/11/2019)
- Not many of the 200 invited in that round would have accepted the invite as a 491 grant will prevent a person who later gets more points for a 189, being able to be also granted a 189 (or 190) for 3 years. So they would decline to lodge a 491. So those EOIs will reopen for a second invite before the 11th Feb 2020 round
- Similarly the 300 invites for the 491 in the 10th January 2020 round would also have had a low uptake number.
- These people who do not accept a Dec 2019 or Jan 2020 invite can for NO FEE lodge a new 491 EOI each month, keep getting a new invite, and so have insurance should they never get the more lucrative 189 or 190 invite

So we believe DHA have seen the VERY POOR uptake of the 491 invites and had to increase the monthly invite numbers from 200, 300, 300 now 500 in this new category

I expect DHA will continue to invite 491s in VERY HIGH numbers so they can get actual visa applications to show how "well" they are doing with this new regional visa

11) NSW Work experience for 190 Nominations

we have received a detailed reply from the NSW government as follows...

NSW approach to skilled employment

Below I will outline the reasons for our approach to continue to only consider skilled employment after the relevant skills assessing authority deems the client to have met the entry level requirements for the occupation.

Our program is highly competitive with tens of thousands of candidates having submitted Expressions of Interest (EOIs) and only 3,000 places available this financial year.

To select candidates, we rank them according to their:

1. Total points score,
2. English language ability, and
3. Years of skilled employment.

With so many candidates who have submitted EOIs for NSW nomination, years of skilled employment is often the differentiator for who receives an invitation.

We believe that the most consistent and equitable way to deliver our program is by continuing to implement this definition of skilled employment as outlined above. Reasons for this include:

- it can be applied equally to all candidates, including those who have obtained positive skills assessments without having completed an educational qualification
- with many candidates competing for few places, we believe it is important to prioritise candidates with higher employment experience as recognised by the relevant skills assessing authority.

(The NSW state government have made it clear why they have chosen to have this interpretation. There is no point contacting them directly about this as they have full discretion to implement their own selection policy)

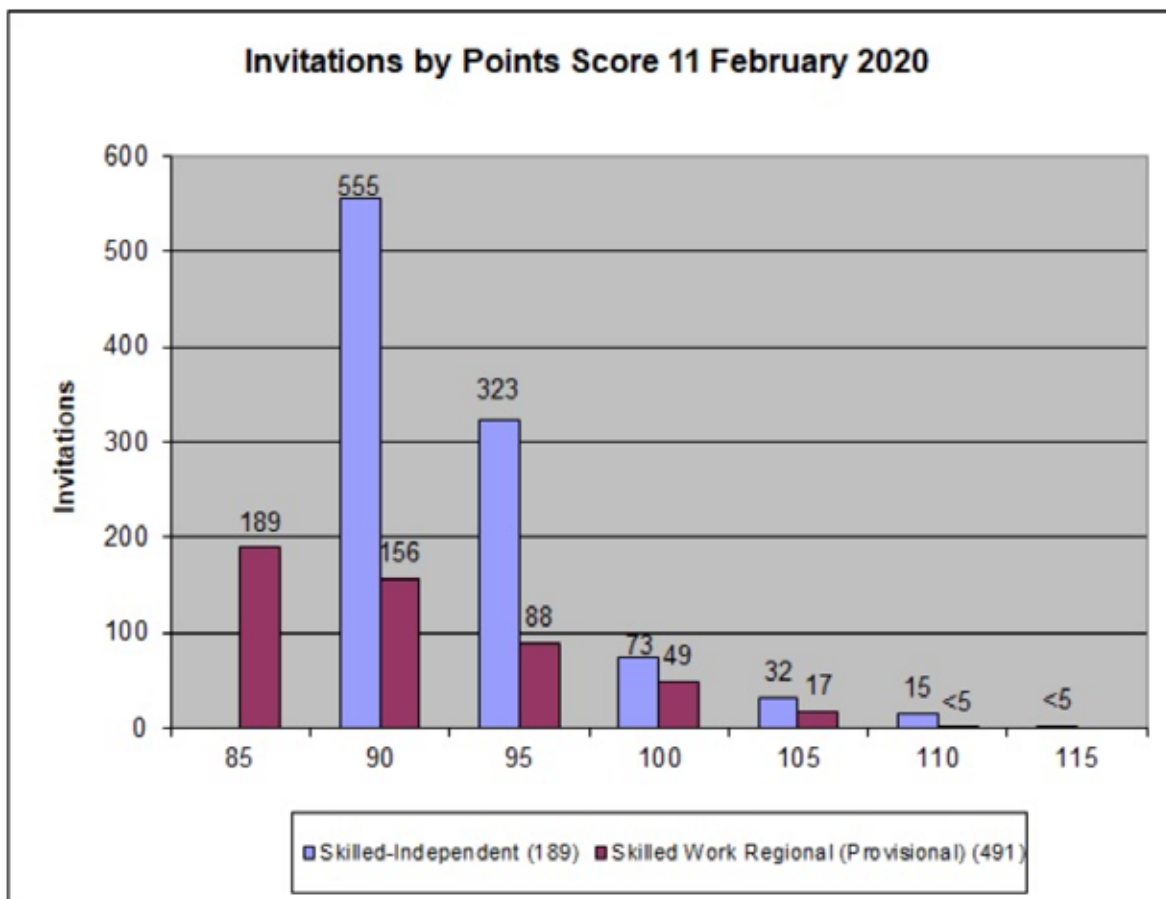

Due to high levels of demand, and in keeping with previous years, the below occupation groups will be subject to pro rata arrangements to ensure availability of invitations across the program year.

SkillSelect first allocates available places to Skilled – Independent visas (subclass 189) and then the remaining to Skilled Work Regional (Provisional) visa (subclass 491) – Family Sponsored . If all places are taken up by subclass 189 visas then there will be no invitations issued for subclass 491 visas in these occupations.
